#### WELCOME TO HOLY WEEK!



Welcome to Holy Week! For Christians around the world, this is our most important week of the whole year as we profess our faith in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Church is the place to be during Holy Week. This is our main event! It's our March Madness of the liturgical year! This tournament of devotion is why we have been praying, fasting and doing works of charity for the past 40 days of Lent. days here at Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph Parish. Our Pastoral Staff, liturgical ministers and musicians have been working hard to prepare for these solemn events that are the wonderful expressions of our worship and prayer.

These days are packed with inspirational rituals and powerful symbols of our Catholic faith that speak volumes to what we believe as followers of Jesus. They are guaranteed to inspire us and fill us with hope.

Every Catholic should at least once in their lifetime experience all that the Triduum —meaning the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil — has to offer. To experience them in their entirety is a unique spiritual experience.

Maybe this is the year you can make it happen? I promise that if you do, you will gain a whole new understanding and appreciation of Holy Week having made the prayerful journey through these three consecutive days.

#### DINE WITH JESUS ON HOLY THURDAY

Join us on Thursday night as we recall the events of the Last Supper and the sacred gift of the Eucharist that Jesus gave to his disciples and to us. Be present to the real presence that Christ offers to us in Holy Communion.

Holy Thursday is one of those few times in the year when we as a parish family can actually gather around the table of the Lord. It is a time to be united in our faith, with all the diversity that is very much a part of our parish.

Holy Thursday allows us to appreciate the gift of faith that enables us to carry on the mission and ministry of Jesus. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave us the Great Commandment to love and serve one another. Today we are his disciples on a mission, called to do what he did for us long ago.

#### STEP INTO A CHURCH ON GOOD FRIDAY

On Good Friday, make sure that you step into a church, even if it's just for five minutes for a quick prayer. If you are out of town traveling on the road with your family this Good Friday, find a church to visit. Say a prayer together and remember what happened on the cross.

When a loved one dies in our family, we are compelled to go to their wake and pay our respects. We wouldn't think of missing it.

Well, the same is true with the death of Jesus. Good Friday is our day to pay our respects to Jesus, who gave His life for us on the cross. That is why we venerate the cross on Good Friday. It reminds us that he loved us to death.

The big question that is always raised on Good Friday is, "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" This Friday, may our response be, "Yes, Lord, here I am!"

#### CHECK OUT THE LIGHTS ON HOLY SATURDAY

The Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening has it all... fire, lights, fresh water, joyful alleluias, the best scripture stories from our ancestors, those being received into the Catholic faith through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, and the renewal of our own baptismal promises. If you come to the Easter Vigil, you certainly won't be bored. If fact, you will be in awe of all that takes place. The liturgy, even though it is longer than our typical Sunday Mass, is filled with so much that represents the heart and soul of our Catholic faith. Come and enjoy the Easter Vigil. It's a great night to be Catholic!

We are blessed this year to have 8 adults who will be fully initiated into the Catholic church at the Easter Vigil. They have been part of the RCIA program (the *Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults*) since September, and they have been learning each week about the beliefs and practices of our Catholic faith.

Daniel Chen and James P'Pool will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Charlie Chmelik, Anna Harlow and Meghan Ryan were already baptized in another Christian denomination and will publicly convert to the Catholic faith. Kathy Wong Saines, Tabitha Schein and Nicholas McCullough are already baptized Catholic and will receive, with the newly baptized and converts, the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion.

We are so happy and proud of these men and women. What a great addition to our *"Family of Families!"*

Let us together intentionally make our Easter Sunday celebrations a joyful and rewarding experience for all, especially for those who may be returning to Church after a long absence. # ICSJ Lent 2024

Until we take the time to be quiet, we will not hear God. God cannot be heard in noise, restlessness, or distraction. God will speak to us if we give God a chance if we listen if we will be guiet. 'Be still' the psalmist wrote, "and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10).

Sometimes we may feel like we are too mentally or emotionally weary and tired to connect with God in our hearts. We just aren't there! The good news is that even during these times of trouble, we can turn our tired heart to God. Don't try to make the agenda for your prayer time. Just sit and "Listen to the Lord!"

During Lent we will use the questions below at our Sunday Masses to help us hear what God is try trying to tell us. May our Lenten gospels lead us away from the darkness we face in life and enable us to live in the light of God's love.

#### Ash Wednesday "Turn away from sin, and be faithful to the gospel"

What is your attitude as you enter Lent this year?

- What do you hope will happen this Lent?
- . What would you like to do this Lent to make it more meaningful for you and your family?

#### First Sunday of Lent

"Jesus is tempted in the desert by the Satan"

- What is one temptation that you may experience this week and what will you do resist it?
- Jesus was called into the quiet of the desert so he could better hear the calling of his Father. Where is a guiet place that you can go in order to better listen to your heart?

#### Second Sunday of Lent "Jesus is transfigured on the mountain"

- When, where, and how do you recognize Jesus when you encounter him?
- What was your last experience of awe?
- How were you changed by this event?
- What is God trying to tell me through this encounter?

#### Third Sunday of Lent "Jesus cleanses the temple area"

- Where are places you experience the presence of God?
- What are the things within us that we need Jesus to overturn and drive out in order to live in God's light?
- Jesus was angry at times. When is your anger a good. thing? When is it not?

#### Fourth Sunday of Lent

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son"

- What difference does Jesus make in your life?
- What was it like to find light in the darkness?
- How has God's love for you opened your eyes and heart?

#### Fifth Sunday of Lent

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be gloried"

- How do you identify yourself?
- · What parts of your identity do you usually share with others (nationality, race, religion, gender, occupation or others)?
- How do you live out your identity as a child of God?

#### Palm Sunday

"Jesus dies on the cross"

- How do you identify with in this great story about love and sacrifice?
- Which person, or group of people in the Passion story, stands out the most for you? Why?
- Are there similarities in your life?







## What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
