


April 21, 2024 | Fourth Sunday of Easter



#### ONE BIG LEAP OF FAITH



"Hey, did you watch the news last night?"

That's what I asked Teddy Merkle, my life-long friend from childhood.

"No. I was at a soccer game with my grandson. What did I miss?" he asked.

"Well, I was watching the news with Fr. McBrady, and there was a really neat story about baby penguins in Antarctica?"

"Really?" Teddy said. I noticed a frown forming on his face. I could tell that somewhere in the back of his mind he was wondering why I just brought up the topic of baby penguins. Usually I have a couple of stupid dad jokes to share with him whenever we meet.

"Yes. It was a fantastic story. You should google it. There's amazing footage from the folks at National Geographic. They captured something for the first time on film. Hundreds of baby penguins bravely dove off a massive 50 -foot cliff for their first-ever swim in the icy ocean waters below. It's called fledging, when they take their first swim.

Normally, they just jump off some sea ice that is only one or two feet high. But the place they chose to enter was totally different- it was much more difficult and a lot more dangerous. Scientists are guessing that this has never done before."

"That sounds amazing," Teddy said with curiosity growing in his voice.

"The best part was when they got to the very edge of the cliff. There was this brief pause as they scope things out. They inched to the ledge, looking straight down into the icy waters.

It seemed like they were also looking at one another to see who wanted to be the first to jump.

Suddenly one brave chick leaps out. He flaps his helpless wings on the way down and lands in the water with a huge splash. The rest of his buddies on the cliff are scanning the water to see if he made it. A few seconds later you see the penguin pop up and safely swim along."

"That is neat," Teddy said.

"Yes. As you watch the video, it looks like the penguins were wondering, 'Okay...Who's next?' Then another guy takes off. Slowly one by one, they take this great leap of faith."

"Sounds like you got a good story for a homily," Teddy said.

"I do. I think many folks can really relate to having to take that leap of faith in their life. Sometimes, we have to be the first one to take a big risk. Sometimes we're not

exactly sure how things are going to work out for us, but we pray and hope for the best-like starting a new job, or moving to a new city, or ending a relationship and starting a new one. Talk about surrendering totally!"

I appreciated Teddy's simple advice. Then I wondered... when God rolled the stone away from the tomb for Jesus, was he asking his son to make a leap of faith?

"Yes, Father," Teddy said. "But I think there's more to your story."

"Like what?" I asked.

"Well, from my experience, when it comes to making a leap of faith, it's not just once in our life, but we may actually have to make a bunch of them, over and over again."

I complimented him with, "You're right."

Teddy continued, "For example, parents take leaps of faith all the time -like when their kids are born; when they grow up to be teenagers; when they move away to college; when they have to make a bunch of decisions for them that hopefully turn out to be good ones."

"You're right." I said again.

Then, Teddy got really deep on me. He said, "Father, I bet you made a ton of 'leaps of faith' in your life. I bet you took a leap of faith on the day you were ordained. You certainly didn't know everything about priesthood when you were 25 years old. I bet you still don't know everything about priesthood even now at 65. The Church has changed and life continues to be full of surprises. Leaps of faith happen all the time.

What I have learned is to expect to be brought to the edge of the cliff, and to hope you have enough courage and faith to jump.

You know, Father, remember this, if the penguins don't jump into the ocean, they will die of starvation. They have to go into the water to be fed."

"Right," I said. "I guess sometimes there is no other choice than to just jump."

"Yep," Teddy said. "But make sure that when you preach your homily, remind folks that even the penguins knew that God was with them. We are never on our own!"





## What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
