#### "OKAY...NOBODY DROPS"

I once served in a parish that had a very active Catholic *Charismatic Group* that met every Monday night. The group consisted of about 30 very friendly and pious parishioners. They had their own personal chaplain who would faithfully come to the parish to hear their confessions and celebrate Mass for them.

In the middle of one cold winter, the group leader, Martha, called me frantically on a Monday morning. She told me that their priest was out sick with the flu, and asked if I could cover their evening Mass.

I checked my calendar. Luckily, I was free. I told Martha that I would be glad to fill-in. It would be a good opportunity to get to know the folks in the group.

I then mentioned to the Martha, "You know, I have to be honest. I never actually celebrated a 'Charismatic Mass' before. Can you tell me how it works? Is there something that I should know? Is there anything different?"

She said, "Well Father, it's just like a regular Mass. The only thing we do special is the healing service that takes place right after your homily."

"How does that work?" I asked Martha.

She said, "Everyone comes up to the altar, just like we do at communion time on Sunday, in a single-file line. As each person comes up, you place your hands on top of their head. Then you call down the Holy Spirit, to come upon them, and fill them with healing and peace."

"That sounds easy enough," I told Martha. Then I asked, "Do I have to say anything?"

She said, "No. This part is usually done in silence. There might be some music in the background."

Then Martha dropped the other shoe. She continued with, "Now Father, just to let you know we will have two 'catchers' available. So everyone will be safe."

"Catchers?" I asked.

"Yes. We have a couple of men assigned to catch anyone who might become 'slain' by the Spirit. Some people might begin speaking in tongues. Usually people get overwhelmed when the Holy Spirit descends upon them. Often, they begin to fall backwards.

The guys are really good at catching them. They gently lay them down on the ground in the sanctuary. They haven't missed anyone yet. When folks come back to their senses after a few minutes, the catchers help them back up and walk them to their pew."

"That's good to know," I said.

When I heard about the charismatic catchers, I got nervous, and uncomfortable. I said, "Martha, I have to be honest with you. I don't have that special gift. Nobody can drop when I place my hands on their heads. If they drop, then somebody will have to pick me up as well. If I see someone drop, I'm going to pass-out too. I'm not that strong. You will need someone to catch me?"

She laughed and said, "Don't worry Father, you will be okay. The Holy Spirit would never hurt you."

The good news is that I made it through the Mass with no one dropping on me. Thank God!

The bad news is that back then I was afraid that the Holy Spirit might show-up, and work through me like never before. I was not fully open to what God might do. I quickly erected guardrails so that I would stay in my lane, and the Holy Spirit would stay in its lane.

Ironically, it is the Holy Spirit that has the power to set us free. We just have to trust, believe and be not afraid. If not, we will be spiritually paralyzed, and very limited.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. We recall how the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, appearing as tongues of fire and with the sound of a driving wind. It's all very dramatic.

The disciples were resuscitated by the Holy Spirit. Remember that they were hiding out of fear for their lives, feeling sorrow and guilt of not only losing Jesus but having abandoned and betrayed him. They were locked up in their own misery.

It is the Holy Spirit that gives them new life. Their relationships are restored, and the community is healed. They overcame their fear and return to their ministry. They are now free to go forth. The Holy Spirit supports and sustains them, empowering them with gifts for the good of the Church.

The Spirit is present to us and continues to be poured out upon us, to heal our wounds and give us new strength. We may not end up fainting in Church, or speaking in tongues; but here are a few ways that we might experience the Holy Spirit at work.

- When we pray for guidance and you receive **WISDOM**, that is the gift of the Spirit.
- When you are tempted to do or say something rash and you resist by saying a quick Hail Mary, God's Spirit of COUNSEL is giving you restraint.
- When you are looking for credit for your accomplishments, the FEAR OF THE LORD, reminds you that all your talents come from God.
- When you are confused about what the Church teaches on moral issues and a homily gives you new insight, the Spirit is granting you KNOWLEDGE and UNDERSTANDING.
- When you are at the end of your rope, but keep persevering on faith, you are being filled with FORTITUDE.

 When you are feeling restless at Mass but a hymn fills you with a sense of God's love, the Spirit is giving you PIETY.

On this Pentecost Sunday... what do you need the Holy Spirit to bring you?

Be not afraid of what you just might get!





### Why Register at a Parish?

- It is a sign of commitment and support to the life of a parish community and indicates willingness to belong to our parish family.
- Our Parish Staff will have the basic information needed to communicate with individual families, especially in times of emergency.
- Every Catholic needs to have their sacramental information documented. Copies of one's Baptismal, First Communion, Confirmation, and Marriage records are required at various times in our life.
- Families that enroll their children in our Parish School or Religious
   Education Program should be registered and active in the parish, especially if they intend to have their children receive the Sacraments.
- Families are able to receive important information about the parish that often comes through direct mailing.
- For Godparents, it is required to provide information stating active parish registration, practice of faith and ongoing support to the overall life of the parish.

# What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
