

# COMING AND GOING, AND COMING AGAIN



What is unique about our parish is that we have about 100 parishioners who come into to our parish and about another 100 parishioners who leave our parish every year. Some folks are only with us for a short time, maybe for just a few years, before they get relocated because of school, or work, or an opportunity to purchase a new home out in the suburbs. Unlike other Catholic parishes, ours is a very transitional one.

Good people are here now, and then they are gone. This is especially true of our young adult population.

Our "Family of Families" is constantly changing. As you can imagine, this presents several challenges when it comes to ministering to our parish's spiritual needs on a

long-term basis. It is also difficult as people become actively engaged in the life of the parish and then, sadly have to leave. This means that our Parish Staff is constantly looking for new people to engage to keep our parish vibrant.

Sophia, and her boyfriend Trevor, took me out to lunch last week to say goodbye. It was a bitter- sweet moment. Sophia is moving back to Minnesota to live with her folks, and Trevor will be moving to Boston this summer to get his degree from Harvard's School of Business.

I met Sophia and Trevor three years ago when they, and two of their friends, moved into to the Old Town Park Towers right behind St. Joseph Church. Sophia's apartment actually looked right down on the back of St. Joseph's Church. I often kidded her that there was no reason for her and her possie of friends to be late for Mass on Sunday.

At lunch Sophia said, "I'm all packed, and I leave tomorrow. Trevor is going to drive the truck. We got movers to load the truck for us.

One of the hardest things about moving is having to leave the parish. We really liked it here. We liked going to church. We got a lot out of the Mass, especially the music and the homilies. We are going to miss it. Our time here was very rewarding. We just want to thank you for everything."

The last thing Sophia did before taking-off to Minnesota on Saturday, was text me a picture from her apartment window. She gave a nice thumbs-up to St. Joseph's on her way out.

Saying goodbye is never easy. It's even harder when our lives have been woven together and good friendships have been formed.

One of the ways that I know that we are "doing 'parish' right" is when it is hard for people to leave our faith community. It is good to know that in just a short time

that we became a spiritual home for someone. In some way we made a spiritual impact that allowed them to come closer to Jesus.

Because our parish family is constantly evolving, I become more and more mindful and grateful for those who are here today in the pews. I realize that our time together in life is limited and precious because of the various paths that come our way.

Knowing that we may not always be together, calls us to be even more intentional to make the best of what God has given us. Let us appreciate the people that God puts into our life, and enjoy the journey of faith we take together, today.

# MAKING RADICAL HOSPITALITY HAPPEN

Jesus said to his disciples,

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you.
Remain in my love.
If you keep my commandments,
you will remain in my love,
just as I kept my Father's commandments,
and remain in his love.
This is my commandment:
love one another as I love you.

At all of our Masses this weekend, our homilies will focus on the importance of offering hospitality, welcome and a sense of belonging to all. This invitation echoes Jesus' command to love one another. Radical hospitality, when done well, can have a huge impact upon the spirit and life of a parish.

It is obvious in the bible that Jesus frequently joined others for a meal. To the shock and dismay of the religious leaders he welcomed everyone- even the lost, the sinners, the ugly and the undesirable. He gave special attention to those who were often overlooked and ignored. He showed them dignity and respect, knowing and believing that we are all "children of God."

How can you foster the sense of hospitality and welcome in our parish? Can you introduce yourself to the person who is always sitting next to you in the pew at Mass? What would it take get to know them better? Can you meet other parishioners after Mass when coffee and donuts are offered? Can you hold someone else in your prayer?

Often those who are visiting our parish for the first time tell me that they feel automatically welcomed. They describe our community as warm and friendly, instead of one that is cold and stuffy.

I guess one way of looking at it is that all of us are on the Parish Welcoming Committee. Radical hospitality is not going to happen if it is assigned to just a handful of people.

# What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
